Thanksgiving crowds point to success

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STUARTS DRAFT — Despite lines along Wayne Avenue on Wednesday in front of their shop — Miller's Bake

Shoppe — the Millers were undaunted. Up since 2 a. m. to continue baking their fresh dinner rolls and blueberry pies, they were prepared for the Thanksgiving rush.

"We just started baking yesterday," Miriam Miller said.

David Miller, her husband, baked the more than 4,500 rolls and breads at 3:30 a. m. the day before. Miriam Miller

was beside him, baking cakes and pies, many recipes dating back for generations.

"We're still making rolls," Miriam Miller said.

Some folks, like George Allen, had called ahead, ordering the carrot and German chocolate cakes in advance. Standing beside David Miller, in a dozen-deep line was Carol Mawyer of Waynesboro. She

was picking up her mother-in-law's pre-ordered rolls.

"It's good food," she said.

Penny Loan of Raphine has been coming to the bake shop before the holidays since the Miller's took over.

"I come to get rolls, but I end up with all this stuff," she said pointing to the peanut butter pie, German chocolate cake and cinnamon rolls. "It's good."
